DA ARTT PROGRAM

The District Attorney Acquiring Restitution
Through Talent Program (DA ARTT) engages
first-time youth offenders in a restorative justice
program through which they receive artistic
mentorship, create and sell artworks to fund
victim restitution, and have their juvenile record
expunged. The expansion and growth of this
partnership has been supported by Arts in
Society, which seeks to support projects that
engage artists and arts organizations as
partners in illuminating and finding solutions to
a wide array of civic and social challenges faced
by Colorado communities.

CREATIVE AGING

Think 360 Arts' Creative Aging program promotes lifelong learning and the infusion of arts in older adult populations. The expansion of this program has been supported by NextFifty Initiative. NextFifty Initiative's partnership allows us to engage older adults in social, community-building activities by offering customized programs in a variety of art-forms, offering multiple entry points for engagement and success.



PROGRAMS IN GREATER COLORADO

Programs in 10 rural counties received subsidies in 2018-2019, providing for performances, artist residencies, and more.

Colorado Arts Partnership (CAP) Grants, a collaborative grant-making program between Colorado Creative Industries (CCI) and Think 360 Arts, supports innovative projects throughout the state that demonstrate strong collaboration among community arts partners and teachers.

Thanks to the generous sponsorship from Otten Johnson Robinson Neff + Ragonetti PC, we were able to offer several scholarships to educators in Greater Colorado for our Institute for Creative Teaching, an in-depth week-long summer institute, in collaboration with the University of Denver's Morgridge School of Education, offering the theory and practice of arts integration. Scholarship winners also received a free artist residency program for their school in the 2019-2020 school year.
